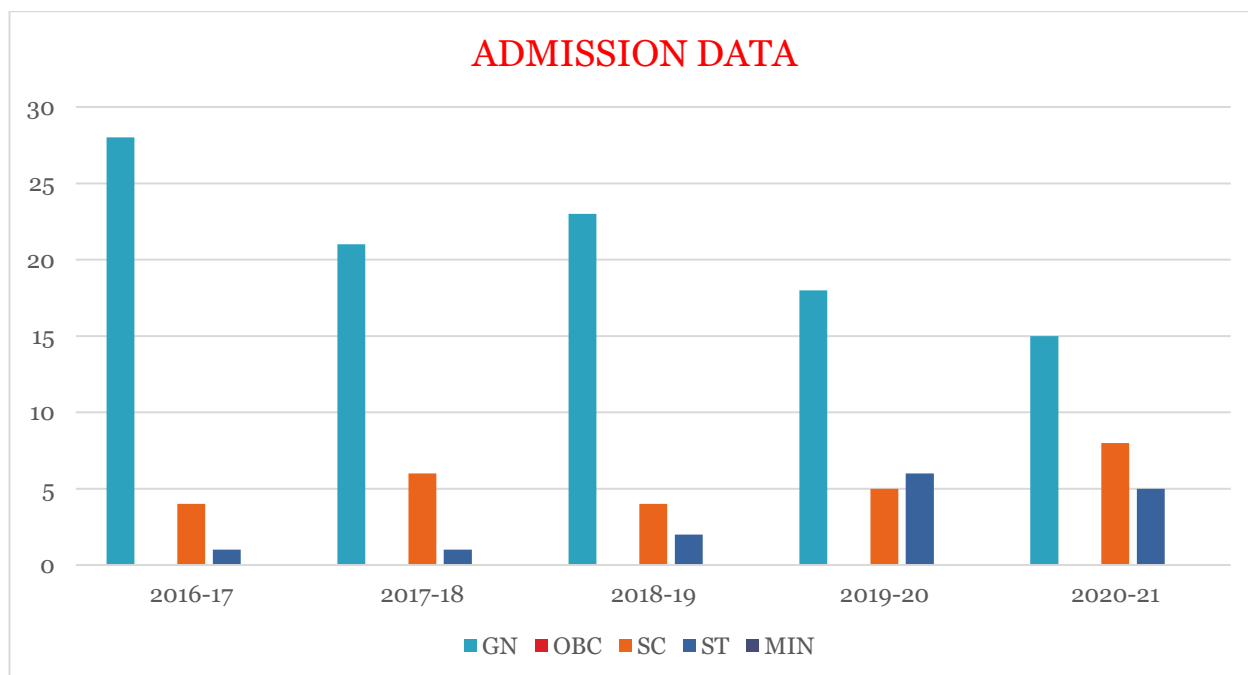


## STUDENTS PROFILE
